Prior to leaving the U. S.:

- ALWAYS check with the ISSS office before leaving the U.S. We will verify your I-20/DS-2019 is a valid SEVIS I-20/DS-2019 and your SEVIS record is active, and we will sign the I-20/DS-2019 for travel.
- Bring your most recent I-20/DS-2019 to the ISSS office when requesting travel signature. DO NOT bring an older I-20/DS-2019 for a travel signature. Only the most recent/newest document can be signed.
- You must obtain a travel signature on your I-20/DS-2019 form from an Advisor at International Student & Scholar Services in order to re-enter the U.S. after any international travel. To obtain a travel signature, you must visit ISSS and submit a travel signature request.
- Signatures are valid for up to one year (up to 6 months for F-1 students on post-completion OPT) but are not valid for re-entry beyond the I-20 or DS-2019 expiration date.
- You must carry your I-20 or DS-2019 endorsed for travel, visa, passport, and transcripts to re-enter the U.S.
- Generally, you will need to have a valid F-1 or J-1 visa stamp in your passport to be able to return to the U.S.
- Make sure your passport has at least six months of validity left from the date you plan to re-enter the U.S. If your passport will expire within the next six months, plan to renew your passport before returning to the U.S.
- Transit visas are required by many countries. If your flight home has connections in another country, you may be required to have a transit visa for that particular country. Students without direct flights from the U.S. to their home country are advised to be aware of where the plane may arrive or where they may have connecting flights. For more information on transiting, visit the visa section of the website for the country you will be traveling through.

If you are renewing your STUDENT VISA while abroad, you will need additional documents for your visa interview:

- 1. Current proof of funding
- 2. Copy of transcript. (Obtain from Registrar or through http://mybama.ua.edu)
- 3. Confirmation of Enrollment letter (Optional, but recommended. Obtain from Registrar or through http://mybama.ua.edu)

If you have obtained a new visa stamp or passport, please report to ISSS within ten days of returning to the U.S. so that copies can be made to update your file.
