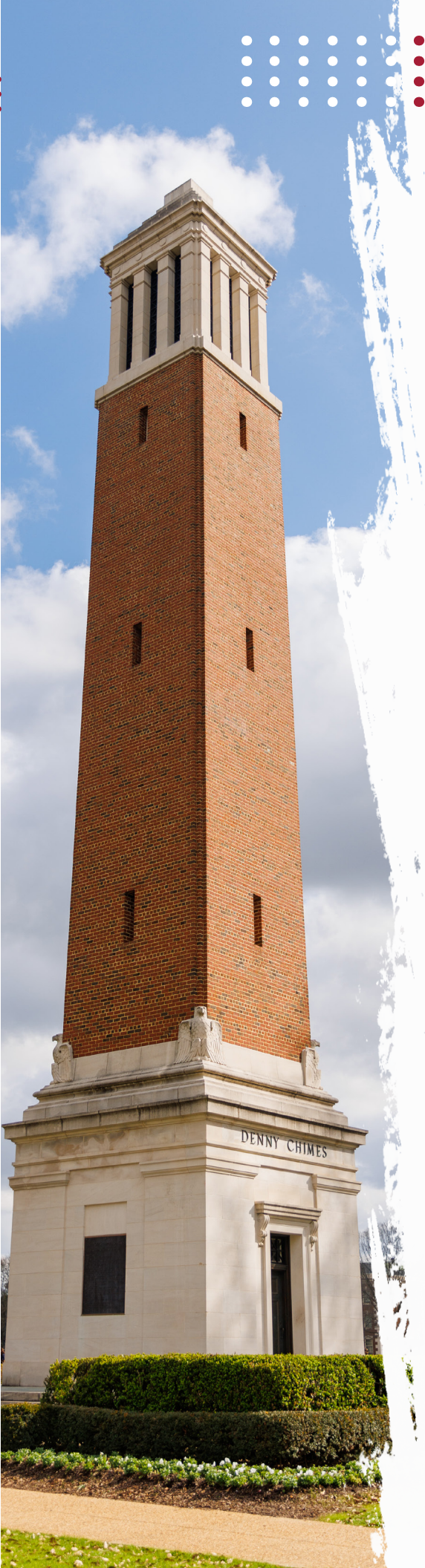

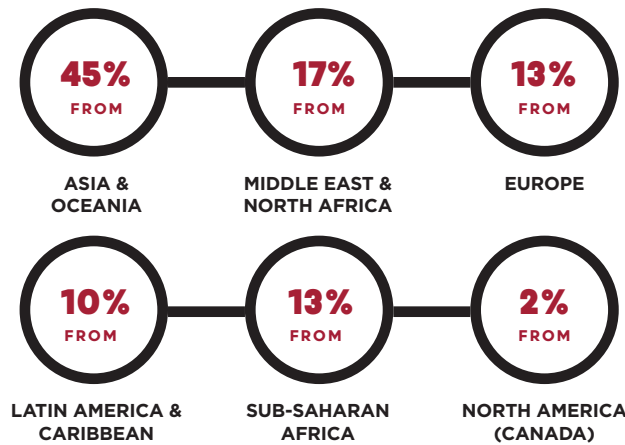

TO APPLY

Students may apply to UA using the Common App or the UA application at admissions.ua.edu/apply and pay the \$40 application fee.

All students must meet English proficiency requirements, including:

*Students may be required to enroll in one or two English language support courses administered by the English Language Institute. For more information, please visit: international.ua.edu/iss/future-new-students/english-programs-for-new-students.

OR you can apply to be admitted conditionally and begin your courses in the English Language Institute. Once you successfully complete the English Language Institute, you may begin academic courses.

International students graduating outside the U.S. are not required to submit SAT or ACT scores for admission, but scores must be submitted to be eligible for scholarships.

UA's ACT code is **0052**, and our SAT code is **1830**.

The above instructions are for international freshman students who are graduating outside of the U.S. For additional admission instructions, see admissions.ua.edu/international.

The University of Alabama admits new students three times a year: spring, summer and fall. We encourage incoming freshman students to apply for fall and spring, as summer is a short, intense semester and is often challenging for new students.

2024 International Competitive Scholarships

To be eligible for competitive scholarships, students must submit an application and all supporting documents to UA by the deadlines indicated below:

- Spring Admission: November 1
- Fall Admission: January 15

UA Competitive Admissions Scholarship	All students who submit an application for admission and all supporting documents by January 15 will be considered for competitive scholarships, regardless of their decision to submit standardized test scores for admission consideration. 2024 International Automatic Scholarships

International incoming first-time freshmen who have a qualifying score on the ACT or SAT (critical reading and math scores only) by the end of February and have at least a 3.5 cumulative high school GPA through December of their senior year will be eligible for the automatic merit-based scholarships in the chart below.

To be eligible for automatic scholarships, students must submit an application and all supporting documents to UA by the priority deadlines: November 1 for spring admission and January 15 for summer/fall admission.

For spring entry, UA will accept test scores through December and transcripts through May of a student's junior year.

For summer/fall entry, UA will accept test scores and transcripts through December of a student's senior year.

TUSCALOOSA, ALABAMA

About an hour southwest of Birmingham, Alabama, in the southeastern United States, Tuscaloosa is situated along the banks of the Black Warrior River in west-central Alabama.

The UA campus is located about 3 hours from Atlanta, 3.5 hours from Nashville and about 4.5 hours from the beaches of the Alabama coast on the Gulf of Mexico.

Tuscaloosa has a moderate climate with an average summer temperature of 30-35 degrees Celsius and 10-15 C in winter.
