

TUSCALOOSA. ALABAMA

- O About an hour southwest of Birmingham, Alabama, in the southeastern United States, Tuscaloosa is situated along the banks of the Black Warrior River in west-central Alabama.
- O The UA campus is located about 3 hours from Atlanta, 3.5 hours from Nashville and about 4.5 hours from the beaches of the Alabama coast on the Gulf of Mexico.
- O Tuscaloosa has a moderate climate with an average summer temperature of 30-35 degrees Celsius and 10-15 C in winter.









TO APPLY

Students may apply to UA using the Common App or the UA application at apply.ua.edu and pay the \$40 application fee. All students must meet English proficiency requirements, including:

International students graduating outside the U.S. are not required to submit SAT or ACT scores for admission, but scores must be submitted to be eligible for scholarships.

UA's ACT code is 0052, and our SAT code is 1830.

The University of Alabama admits new students three times a year: spring, summer and fall. We encourage incoming freshman students to apply for fall and spring, as summer is a short, intense semester and is often challenging for new students.

2025 International Automatic Scholarships

International incoming first-time freshmen who have a qualifying score on the ACT or SAT (critical reading and math scores only) by the end of December and have at least a 3.5 cumulative high school GPA through the junior year will be eligible for automatic merit-based scholarships. Students must submit an application for admission and all supporting documents to UA by the deadlines indicated below:

- O Spring Admission: November 1
- O Summer/Fall Admission: January 10

For spring entry, UA will accept test scores through December and transcripts through May of a student's junior year.

For summer/fall entry, UA will accept test scores and transcripts through December of a student's senior year.
