Culture Shock


- Culture shock describes the anxiety that a person experiences when they move from a familiar culture to an entirely new culture or social environment

- It is important to reach out when you need help, and take advantage of the resources available to you


















W-Curve of Cultural Adjustment

Title IX

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a comprehensive federal law that prohibits discrimination based on the gender of students and employees of educational institutions that receive federal financial assistance.

"No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

20 U.S.C. §1681
